



## Addressing **RED** in the NC Juvenile Justice System: FY 22-23: Statewide & Buncombe County Data Review

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## What is **R/ED**?

- "Racial and Ethnic Disparity," as defined by the JJDPA, means that:
  - minority youth populations are involved at a decision point in the juvenile justice system at disproportionately higher rates than non-minority youth at that decision point.

34 U.S.C. § 11103(41)





Juvenile Justice Delinquency and Prevention Act (JJDPA) of 1974

#### **JJDPA 4 Core Protections**

- Deinstitutionalization of Status Offenders 1974 (DSO): 34 U.S.C. § 11133 (a)(11)
- Sight and Sound Separation 1974 (Separation): 34 U.S.C. § 11133 (a)(12)
- Adult Jail & Lock-up Removal 1980 (Jail Removal): 34 U.S.C. § 11133 (a)(11)(B) and (a)(13)

Racial and Ethnic Disparities R/ED formerly (DMC) – 1988
34 U.S.C. § 11133 (a)(15)



## **Compliance with R/ED Core Requirement**





#### State Compliance

- State compliance is required for Title II funding.
- Compliance is achieved when states address RED through:
  - Identification (to <u>identify</u> and <u>reduce</u> racial and ethnic disparities among youth who come into contact with the juvenile justice system)
  - Development of 3-year RED action plan
  - Outcome-based evaluation
- Requires data collection related to 5 "contact points"
- GCC monitors compliance as NC's Designated State Agency ("DSA").












### Complaints Received & Distinct Juveniles FY'23






#### NC Delinquent Complaints By Race/Ethnicity FY 22-23




#### **Detention Placement: Fiscal Year 22-23**







#### YDC CONFINEMENT TRENDS CY 2000 - 2023








## FY 22-23 Offense Class Group Comparison by Race/Ethnicity







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


#### Buncombe Delinquent Complaints FY 22-23



#### Complaints Not Approved/Diverted by Race /Ethnicity










#### Buncombe County Offense Class Group Comparison by Race/Ethnicity FY 22-23





- Use data to help law enforcement, judges, community leaders, and other decision-makers understand racial and ethnic disparities within their jurisdictions.
- Discuss the data with JCPCs to assist them in their annual planning.
- Utilize data to determine the best way to allocate funding dollars.
- Analyze available resources and use data to ensure that all youth have equal access to opportunities.
- Talk to law enforcement officials to share data, understand their policies, and inquire about diversion programs for youth.
- Seek community and family input on the matter and listen to what young people have to say.
